COVID related respite service

Grants can be awarded to carers needing respite in their own home.

To qualify need to be / have the following;

- To be an unpaid carer for an older person living with dementia.
- Living in Worthing/Adur.
- To be in receipt of means tested benefits ie pension credit.

We now have funding for Butterflies which is due to start in April for one day a week initially and will look to be Methold based.

We can provide Time Out for Carers however, most of our clients now fall into the Extremely Vulnerable Group and have chosen to shield. We are accepting new referrals for both services and assessing people ready to hopefully re open in April.

Please call Customer Services if you are interested in either of the above as we are offering telephone support to all clients and all on our waiting lists.

All Learning Disabilities services remain open apart from the Extremely Vulnerable Group.

Ashdown is also open as above.
